PE kit-

White T-shirt, black shorts, pumps/trainers. PE will also be outside weather permitting (black jacket/hoodie and black jogqing bottoms or leggings.)

Earrings need to be taken out for PE or tape need to be supplied.

Children will come home in their PE Kit on a Tuesday and Thursday with their school uniform in a bag.

Please ensure all items of PE kit has your child's name in — Your child is responsible for all items of clothing

Reading Books

Reading books will go home each night. They are changed as and when your child finishes the book and **it has been signed by an adult at home.** Children will be responsible for changing their own books in Year 3.

Please listen to your child read as often as possible – at least three times a week is expected.

READING BOOKS NEED TO BE IN SCHOOL EVERY DAY

Homework

Spellings will be sent home on a **Tuesday** and children will be tested the **following Tuesday**.

Spelling results will be given to children either Tuesday afternoon or Wednesday.

Learning Logs – will be given at the half term holidays in October, February and May. **It is expected that these** are <u>completed and returned</u> to school <u>within two weeks.</u>

Number bonds and time tables homework will also be given. This will be given on a Friday but not every week.

Other homework will be given as and when required depending on individual need. A text will be sent to advise you when this has been given.

Reminders

Earrings must be **stud earring only for safety reasons.** These <u>MUST</u> be removed ideally on PE days by either your-self or your child. Staff are <u>NOT</u> allowed to remove or put in children's earrings.

Children may wear a wrist watch in school to help them to tell the time. Children will need to be responsible for these.

PE kit MUST be in school on PE days. Unfortunately there is no spare PE kit in school.

Nail polish is **NOT** allowed in school. If children have nail polish on at the weekend or during the holidays, **PLEASE** ensure that this is removed before children return to school. This includes gel nails.

Finally please ensure your child's name is in all clothing, this includes coats and PE kit. This makes it so much easier for us to find and return lost items.

If your child is swapping from school lunches to packed lunches, please give the office two weeks notice.

If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to ask. You can either send a note in with your child or speak to the adult on the door after school.
